The Psalm: *Psalm 90.1-12*

- 1 Lord, you have been our refuge •
from one generation to another.
- 2 Before the mountains were brought forth,
or the earth and the world were formed, •
from everlasting to everlasting you are God.
- 3 You turn us back to dust and say: •
'Turn back, O children of earth.'
- 4 For a thousand years in your sight are but as yesterday, •
which passes like a watch in the night.
- 5 You sweep them away like a dream; •
they fade away suddenly like the grass.
- 6 In the morning it is green and flourishes; •
in the evening it is dried up and withered.
- 7 For we consume away in your displeasure; •
we are afraid at your wrathful indignation.
- 8 You have set our misdeeds before you •
and our secret sins in the light of your countenance.
- 9 When you are angry, all our days are gone; •
our years come to an end like a sigh.
- 10 The days of our life are three score years and ten,
or if our strength endures, even four score; •
yet the sum of them is but labour and sorrow,
for they soon pass away and we are gone.
- 11 Who regards the power of your wrath •
and your indignation like those who fear you?
- 12 So teach us to number our days •
that we may apply our hearts to wisdom.

Second Reading: *Romans 8: 31–39*

What, then, shall we say in response to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all—how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things? Who will bring any charge against those whom God has chosen? It is God who justifies. Who then is the one who condemns? No one. Christ Jesus who died — more than that, who was raised to life — is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us. Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword? As it is written:

*“For your sake we face death all day long;
we are considered as sheep to be slaughtered.”*

No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

*Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ
according to Matthew 8:1-10*

In those days when there was again a great crowd without anything to eat, he called his disciples and said to them, ‘I have compassion for the crowd, because they have been with me now for three days and have nothing to eat. If I send them away hungry to their homes, they will faint on the way—and some of them have come from a great distance.’ His disciples replied, ‘How can one feed these people with bread here in the desert?’ He asked them, ‘How many loaves do you have?’ They said, ‘Seven.’ Then

he ordered the crowd to sit down on the ground; and he took the seven loaves, and after giving thanks he broke them and gave them to his disciples to distribute; and they distributed them to the crowd. They had also a few small fish; and after blessing them, he ordered that these too should be distributed. They ate and were filled; and they took up the broken pieces left over seven baskets full. Now there were about four thousand people. And he sent them away. | And immediately he got into the boat with his disciples and went to the district of Dalmanutha.
